Read My Patches - Tell Your Story through Handmade Patches and Pins (1 day)

In this workshop, participants will be guided through the process of making patches and brooches, or a series, from concept to finished piece. You will explore the idea of designing and making patches to tell your personal story through mind-mapping and brainstorming exercises. Participants will leave the workshop with several finished patches, ideas for more, and the confidence to continue making patches to tell the world their personal story.

Kit includes enough supplies for 2 pins and 2 patches:

- Paper Sketchbook - for brainstorming ideas
- Printed Handbook - will include helpful tips and instructions specific to this workshop, links to resources and references, etc.
- Small hoop
- Solvy- Water Soluble Stabilizer
- Pellon EZ Steam 2 – two-sided pressure sensitive fusible web
- Heat'n Bond UltraHold Iron-On Adhesive for patches
- Assortment of felt, fabric and other materials for the patches/ brooches
- Assortment of Embellishments- beads, sequins, threads/ yarn, glue
- Needles
- Assortment of pins - can be used to put on back of brooches/ pins

Essential Tools and Materials

- Scissors (pinking shears, rotary cutters are optional). The instructor will have some to share, but not enough for everyone.

Optional Tools and Materials

- Anything that can be used to embellish the patches (beads, threads, sequins, etc.). **This is a great opportunity to see what's in your stash to share with others too!**
- Fabric - The instructor will supply some fabric in student kits, but you might bring extras like felt, cotton, meaningful clothing that you cut up, denim. This is a great opportunity to bring something sentimental that you would like to repurpose into a pin or patch.
- Bring anything you like to sew with such as a thimble, thread conditioner, etc.
