DAY AND EVENING GROUPS – CLASS CHOICE GUIDELINES

Skill Level

A majority of classes this year are open to all skill levels, but for those classes which indicate a particular skill level, the following will provide some guidance.

Beginner - Little or no skill is expected; no previous experience with the subject or materials (e.g., the stitch, paint, etc.) is required. The class may be directed toward a predesigned project or sampler.

Intermediate - The student has skills upon which to build, having taken a course and/or completed two or three projects along this line. Work in the class may be directed to a specific project but there is a fair amount of latitude in how the project may be completed.

Advanced - The student has a lot of experience in the area and wants to push the boundaries. The student will be largely responsible for the design of the projects that come out of this course.

If you are still uncertain, contact the teacher for further information.

Other Class Information

- Teachers have given much time preparing for classes. It is the student's responsibility to attend each class. If you must be absent, please notify the teacher in advance.
- Plan to attend the Annual General Meeting and Orientation to find out which classes you are in and to pick up your supply list from the teachers. You are expected to come to your first class with the required supplies.
- A kit fee cost is indicated for some of the Day and Evening Classes. This refers to the cost of supplies that are provided by the instructor and therefore payment is not optional. Any kit fees should be paid on Orientation Day.
- Homework is needed in all courses if one wishes to progress. It is specifically assigned in some classes to prepare for the next class.
- For a description of a Basic Sewing Kit, please consult the Guild Members' Handbook.
- Independent Stitchers are those members not taking classes on regular Guild days. Members gather in the Parlour of the church to work on projects of their choice.

Class Choices

There are a number of class configurations available in the Day Group: full year, 6 week, full day and Snowbird. Evening classes include full year, three-week, and (this year) a five-week class November-February. When making your class choices, please check the dates of the classes carefully to avoid overlap. A graphic schedule of classes is provided on the final page of the Day Group Calendar and Evening Group Calendar.

If you know you will be away during the time a full year or multi-week class is offered, please consider registering instead for a 2-full-day class or a Snowbird class that will fit your schedule.

Please make an informed choice when selecting your classes and then commit to the class. Show respect to your teacher and honour the effort she has put into preparing your class by giving her your full attention and effort.
