CLASS CHOICE GUIDELINES

Skill Level

A majority of classes this year are open to all skill levels, but for those classes which indicate a particular skill level, the following will provide some guidance.

Beginner - Little or no skill is expected; no previous experience with the subject or materials (e.g., the stitch, paint, etc.) is required. The class may be directed toward a predesigned project or sampler.

Intermediate - The student has skills upon which to build, having taken a course and/or completed two or three projects along this line. Work in the class may be directed to a specific project but there is a fair amount of latitude in how the project may be completed.

Advanced - The student has a lot of experience in the area and wants to push the boundaries. The student will be largely responsible for the design of the project(s) that come out of this course.

If you are still uncertain, contact the instructor for further information.

Other Class Information

- Instructors have given much time preparing for classes. It is the student's responsibility to attend each class. If you must be absent, please notify the instructor in advance.
- Instructors will let you know by email which class you are in and provide you with your supply list. You are expected to come to your first class with the required supplies.
- A kit fee cost is indicated for some of the classes. This refers to the cost of supplies that are provided by the instructor and therefore payment is not optional. Any kit fees are expected to be paid to the instructor at the first class.
- Homework is needed in many courses if one wishes to progress. It is specifically assigned in some classes to prepare for the next class.
- For a description of a Basic Sewing Kit, please consult the Guild Members' Handbook. A copy is available on the Members Resources page in the Member's section of the website.
- Independent Stitchers are those members not taking classes on regular Guild days.

Class Choices

While most classes take place over 6 sessions, there are occasional classes that take a different form. Please read the class information carefully for the details of your chosen class. You may participate in one class in each of the Fall and Winter sessions. Please give a 1st and 2nd choice when making your decision. Class placement is done on receipt of payment order. If your first-choice class is full you will be assigned to your second class choice. If you choose not to take a class, you may choose to attend as an Independent Stitcher and bring along your own project to work on or the "no class" option which indicates that you will not be attending on class days.
